I. STATEMENT OF THE POLICY

This policy shall serve as a guide to standardize the process of sending and transporting specimens for Real Time Reverse Transcription Polymerase Chain Reaction (RT-PCR) to various testing centers/reference laboratories.

II. POLICY GUIDELINES

- 1. All specimen for RT-PCR shall be referred to the following identified reference laboratories:
 - 1.1 Lung Center of the Philippines (LCP)
 - 1.2 Philippine Genome Center (PGC)
 - 1.3 Philippine Red Cross (PRC)
- 2. The assigned DLM staff shall check the completion of the following documents prior to sending the sample
 - 2.1 Case Investigation Form (CIF)
 - 2.2 Specimen Listing
- 3. The assigned DLM staff shall write "Philippine Heart Center" in all case investigation forms.
- 4. The assigned DLM staff shall transport freshly collected specimen within 24 hours using a tightly sealed and properly labeled transport box to identified reference laboratory.
- 5. Criteria for choosing appropriate reference laboratory shall be the following:
 - 5.1 Lung Center of the Philippines (LCP)
 - 5.1.1 Symptomatic staff on home or facility (5C) quarantine
 - 5.1.2 Symptomatic patients for baseline RT-PCR
 - 5.1.3 Bronchial lavage/ ET aspirate specimens
 - 5.2 Philippine Genome Center (PGC)
 - 5.2.1. Pay Patients suspected or diagnosed as Covid-19 patient
 - 5.2.2 Patients who are for dialysis requiring a baseline RT-PCR testing
 - 5.2.3 Patients for scheduled procedures at Cathlab and Operating Room
 - 5.3 Philippine Red Cross (PRC)
 - 5.3.1 Patients identified as candidates for de-escalation
 - 5.3.2 Patients who are for discharge
 - 5.3.3 PHC asymptomatic staff who are positive in serology surveillance
- 6. The assigned DLM staff shall coordinate including online data submissions with the identified testing centers/ reference laboratory prior to transport.
- 7. The assigned DLM staff shall follow up the availability of results and shall inform the Incident Command Post (ICP) of the result.

- 8. The assigned DLM staff shall furnish the Infection Control Committee a copy of all Case Investigation Forms for encoding.
- 9. The assigned DLM staff shall issue the official RT-PCR result to the Safety Officer.
- 10. Patients who are for discharge shall receive a copy of the official result of RT-PCR once available.
