I. STATEMENT OF THE POLICY

This policy serves as a guide in disposing the remains of suspected or confirmed COVID-19 mortalities.

II. POLICY GUIDELINES

- 1. All staff handling the cadaver shall wear appropriate Personal Protective Equipment (PPE). PPE Set A shall be used during transport.
- 2. Post-mortem care such as cleaning of the body, shaving and the likes shall be prohibited.
- 3. The assigned staff shall remove the cadaver from the room at the earliest possible time after demise.
- 4. The assigned staff shall wrap the cadaver using the linen mortuary sheet, put labels accordingly and place in an airtight leak proof cadaver bag.
- 5. The assigned staff shall decontaminate the outer part of the cavader bag using the approved hospital's disinfectant.
- 6. Unzipping of the bag at any given time shall be prohibited.
- 7. The pathology staff shall ensure that all cadavers are inside the morgue freezer.
- 8. The pathology staff shall coordinate with the funeral service and shall facilitate pick up of the cadaver from the morgue within 12 hours.
- 9. Although the family members are not allowed to view and interact with the deceased, utmost respect in handling the remains in accordance to their religious and cultural beliefs without compromising the integrity of the proper disposal procedure shall be ensured.
