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## **PEDIATRIC COVID Positive Patients and COVID Suspects**

- 1. All patients seen in the emergency room with history of travel and/or symptoms of cough/colds, sore throat, fever and diarrhea shall be treated as COVID suspect depending on symptoms
- 2. All private and service patient without cardiac decompensation or needing immediate intervention shall be transfer to COVID hospital
- 3. Ambulance calls will be limited to employees, PPE shall be provided,
- 4. If patient can not be transferred to referral centers,
  - 4.1 A stable COVID suspect shall be admitted to the COVID ward with a pediatric nurse to handle the case and under the COVID Pedia Team.
  - 4.2 A COVID suspect SARI OR CRITICAL shall be admitted At Pedia Isolation (PICU)

ONLY ONE Caretaker will be allowed who is considered a COVID suspect on regular mask

5. The PEDIA COVID TEAM shall be composed of the Pedia Covid Core Team and the Pedia COVID Strike Team

## A. PEDIA COVID CORE TEAM:

- 1. Pediatric Infectious Disease ICP Team Leader
- 2. Pedia Cardiology
- 3. Pediatric Pulmo Service
- 4. Pedia Critical Care
- 5. PTC Pharmacy and Therapeutics Chairman
- B. PEDIA COVID STRIKE TEAM shall be composed of
  - 1. Pediatric Cardiologist
  - 2. Pediatric Pulmonologist,
  - 3. Pediatric intensivist
  - 4. For Private patients, referral will be upon the discretion of the attending physician
  - 5. The team shall be in charged of the management of COVID patients
    - 5.1 Referral to Pediatric Intensivist shall be activated if severe COVID 19 illness or severe acute respiratory infection
    - 5.2 For non-critical patients, the consultant should make rounds at least once a day to alternate with Pedia Pulmonary consultant by call or with PPE as necessary
    - 5.3 All critical patients shall be referred to the pediatric intensivist.
  - 6. The PIDSP algorithm shall be followed in the management of Pedia COVID patients.
  - 7. If medications and other logistics are not available in the hospital, concern should be coursed through the Medical branch head and the ICP.
  - 9. Only the COVID-19 Team are authorized to escalate or de-escalate COVID -19 positive patients and suspect.
