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## I. STATEMENT OF THE POLICY

This policy shall provide guidance in the admission/transfer of patients in Non-Covid-19 units.

## II. GUIDELINES

- Adult Pay Ward 1 (APW 1) shall be designated as the holding area for newly admitted NON-COVID semi private and pay ward patients while waiting for RT-PCR GeneXpert result. Bed A, B, C will continue as holding area for MICU2.
- 2. The admitting section shall ensure that all newly admitted patients in the holding area have a pre-assigned room.
- 3. Patient should be transferred to appropriate room once the RT-PCR result is in.
  - 3.1 Positive RT-PCR to COVID-19 units
  - 3.2 Negative RT-PCR to pre-assigned NON-COVID room
  - 3.3. Patients with RT-PCR negative result in MICU 2 holding area should be transferred to the main area immediately. For patients with positive RT-PCR result should be transferred to MICU 1.
  - 3.4 Another RT-PCR test may be requested after a negative test if clinically indicated and cleared by IDS.
- 4. For critically ill patients with negative PCR result but still in need of critical care, Medical Intensive Care Unit 2 (MICU2) can be used as a step-down unit.
  - 4.1 Bed A, B, and C will be the holding area for these patients.
- 5. All personnel entering APW 1 (holding area) shall strictly wear the Prescribed Personal Protective Equipment
  - 5.1 Face shield / Eye Protection
  - 5.2 Medical Mask
  - 5.3 Gown
  - 5.4 Gloves (if with patient contact)
  - 5.5 Change Medical Mask to Respirator for Aerosol Generating Procedures
- 6. All personnel entering the holding area of **Medical Intensive Care Unit 2** shall strictly wear the Prescribed Personal Protective Equipment

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- 5.1 Coveralls
- 5.2 Face shield / Eye Protection Respirator Mask (n95)
- 5.3 Gloves
- 5.4 Additional gown on top of the coveralls and medical mask on top of the respirator mask shall be worn for splash generating procedures.
- 7. The basic health protocol measures shall be the following:
  - 6.1 Good Hand Hygiene
  - 6.2 Physical Distancing
  - 6.3 Cough Etiquette
  - 6.4 Regular Cleaning and Disinfection
  - 6.5 Avoidance of touching the nose, mouth and eyes
- 8. Routine Environmental Cleaning (COVID-19) shall be followed. (*Refer to Guidelines GL-ICP-031*).
- 9. If there is a high suspicion of COVID-19, patient will be immediately transferred to designated Covid-19 units.
- 10. Strictly no companion is allowed inside the holding area.
