## I. OBJECTIVE

This shall serve as guidance in issuing clearances for Healthcare Workers who are suspected or confirmed COVID-19 cases upon their return to work.

## II. SCOPE

This guideline applies to all PHC Healthcare Workers.

## III. GUIDELINES

- 1. All healthcare workers with COVID-19 like symptoms shall be relieved from workforce and be properly evaluated and managed in the Emergency Room Special triage.
- 2. Fully vaccinated healthcare workers diagnosed with COVID-19 (asymptomatic, mild & moderate) can be tagged as clinically recovered if:
  - 2.1 At least 7 days of isolation for mild and asymptomatic, 10 days for moderate and 21 days for severe/critical have been completed, and
  - 2.2 No fever for the last 24hours without antipyretic
  - \*Unvaccinated and Partially Vaccinated 14 days isolation
- **3.** For HCWs with high-risk exposure:
  - 3.1 Asymptomatic: Back to work with strict adherence to COVID-19 safety precautions
  - 3.2 Self-monitoring of development of COVID-19 like signs and symptoms. Proceed to ER ST once with COVID-19 like signs and symptoms.
  - 3.3 Strictly wearing of fitted mask should be observed.
- 4. All previous COVID-19 healthcare workers shall seek infirmary clearance prior to work.
- 5. Health management of discharged HCW:
  - 5.1 Return to Work Practices after completing required number of isolation days
  - 5.2 All HCW shall seek Infirmary clearance prior to return to work.
  - 5.3 Wear appropriate Personal Protective Equipment.
  - 5.4 Adhere to hand hygiene, and cough etiquette in CDC's interim infection control guidance (e.g., cover nose and mouth when coughing or sneezing, dispose of tissues in waste receptacles).
  - 5.5 Self-monitor for symptoms and seek re-evaluation from ER ST if respiratory symptoms recur or worsen.
